# New Forest Heart Beat Report



Hello and welcome to the October 2023 Beat Report for the New Forest Heart area. Your team is PC 24901 Mark ROBERTS and PCSO 14495 Richard WILLIAMS.

In November come and see us on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> when we will be in the Deerleap Inclosure with the New Forest District Council's Community Safety team at 8am and then at the Happy Cheese in Ashurst at 11am where we will be joined by the village's Neighbourhood watch coordinator.

On Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> join us at the Bramshaw Stores at 8am and then outside the Bartley Post Office at 9am.

Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> November at 2pm is when we are at the Open Door Community Café in Minstead and finally on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> November we will be outside the Visitors Centre in Lyndhurst at 10am.

Commercial properties in Lyndhurst and Brockenhurst were broken into on the same night at the beginning of the month. Investigations into both of these burglaries are still active as is the investigation into the break in at a storage unit at Ipley where a motorbike, tools and bicycles were stolen. Several barns at Bucklers Hard, a paddock in Minstead, containers on Fletchwood Lane and an outbuilding in Ashurst were also targeted this month.

Four vehicles parked in James Hill, Wilverley Inclosure, Bramshaw Wood and Brockishill Green car parks were broken into and bags and cash stolen, and three cars in Brockenhurst and three vans, one in Cadnam and two in a hotel car park in Ower were also targeted resulting in thousands of pounds worth of tools being taken. Other thefts in October included number plates from a van in Ower, a water trough from a field in Cadnam and power tools from a driveway in Stoney Cross. Vehicles have also been stolen from Fletchwood lane and the car park at Tesco in Brockenhurst.

Four high value bicycles have been stolen, two from outside a coffee shop on Lyndhurst High Street and the other two from hotels on the outskirts of Lyndhurst and Brockenhurst.

Criminal damage has been caused to the children's play equipment at Copythorne Community Centre and to the zip wire at the Netley Marsh Community Hall. It's difficult to know why anyone would do such a thing but if you have any information on this or any of the incidents mentioned then please let us know using the contact details below.

Finally, a driver was stopped in Brockenhurst and was subsequently arrested for being over the drink drive limit
